>> Senior Capstone Projects


Seniors create a project that integrates and applies what they've learned.






Adams State has its own full-time police department that provides 24-hour safety and security every day of the week. Students can register their bicycles or valuables through the Crime Prevention Program.

Please note: Freshmen and sophomores are required to live on-campus.





In order to be considered for admission into Adams State University, prospective **first-time students** must submit the following materials:

- 1. A completed online application for admission.
- 2. A non-refundable \$30 application fee.*
- 3. Official high school transcripts.
- 4. Official ACT and/or SAT scores (except for the high school graduation class of 2021)

Mid-50% High School GPA range of admitted students: 2.9 – 3.7 (4.0 scale, includes weighted GPA)

Mid-50% ACT range of admitted students: 17-22 (composite score) Mid-50% SAT range of admitted students: 910-1090 (taken March 2016 and after)

In order to be considered for admission to Adams State University, prospective **transfer students** must submit the following documents:

- 1. A completed online application for admission.
- 2. A non-refundable \$30 application fee.*
- 3. Official transcripts from all colleges attended.
- Official high school transcripts and official ACT or SAT scores are required of transfer students with less than 24 transferable credits.

Transfer students with 24 or more transferable credits and a cumulative grade point average of 2.30 or higher will be strong candidates for admission into the baccalaureate program.



Nationwide college transfer is made simpler with the Interstate Passport. Adams State is the only university in Colorado that belongs to the Interstate Passport Network, which consists of 31 institutions across 13 states.

The San Luis Valley is the headwaters of the Rio Grande and covers approximately 8,000 square miles with an average elevation of 7,664 feet. Alamosa serves as the capital of the San Luis Valley and has more than 50 restaurants and coffee houses to choose from.

Our region offers some of the coolest attractions west of the Mississippi: Great Sand Dunes National Park and Preserve, Penitente Canyon, Wheeler Geologic Area, Rio Grande Scenic Railroad, Cumbres & Toltec Scenic Railroad, Creede Repertory Theatre, and the world-famous Colorado Gator Farm. Adams State is 1.5 hours from two ski resorts.


